

Programme Entrance Requirements

Applicants are also required to fulfill the **University's Entrance Requirements**.

Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Music

All applicants must have attained a good result in Grade 8 ABRSM practical grade / performance grade or its equivalent (i.e. for Chinese Instruments), and at least a passing result in Grade 5 in ABRSM Theory (or its equivalent), and/or show other evidence of distinction in music. The ABRSM qualifications should be attained before 23 April 2025.

Applicants will be invited to submit a Pre-screening Portfolio, and selected applicants will be invited to attend an On-Campus Audition.

The Prescreening Portfolio includes:

- An audition video of up to 10 minutes that includes two contrasting works from the Western classical or Chinese
 music traditions which represent the applicant's highest level on their major instrument or voice; and
- Additional evidence of the applicant's musical accomplishments (e.g., music-related research, writing samples, original compositions, etc.)

Applicants will be notified of the submission procedures and relevant deadlines by email.

Bachelor of Music (Honours) in Creative Industries

Applicants are required to show proof of Music Proficiency and Evidence of Distinction in Music in both practical (Instrumental/Vocal performance) and theory aspects. Applicants should obtain good results in recognized music and are required to submit a Music Portfolio that demonstrates the potential, talent, development, and vision in Music and Creative Industries.

Music Qualifications:

Grade 8 ABRSM practical grade / performance grade or its equivalent (i.e. for Chinese Instruments), and at least a passing result in Grade 5 in ABRSM Theory (or its equivalent).

Scoring for Film, Television and Video Games Concentration

- A 1-minute video introducing yourself, your goals and aspirations
- 1 or more short video(s) of instrumental performance(s) of existing music
- 1 or more audio recording(s) of the applicant's original composition(s) relevant to the concentration
- Music score(s) of the above original composition(s) (if applicable)

Popular Music Performance and Songwriting Concentration

- A 1-minute video introducing yourself, your goals and aspirations
- 2 or more videos of instrumental and/or singing performances of existing music. Contrasting genres/styles is desirable; and
- 2 or more audio recordings/videos of the applicant's original compositions, and/or original arrangements of existing music performed by the applicant.
- Music score(s) of the above original composition(s)/original arrangements (if applicable)
